Tony Payan, Ph.D., is the Françoise and Edward Djerejian Fellow for Mexico Studies and director of the Center for the U.S. and Mexico at the Baker Institute. He is also an adjunct associate professor at Rice University and a professor at Universidad Autónoma de Ciudad Juárez.

Payan's research focuses primarily on border studies, particularly the U.S.-Mexico border. His work includes studies of border governance; border flows, including immigration; as well as the border environment, including security

and organized crime. Payan has authored two books, co-authored two volumes; and co-edited several volumes, including: "Undecided Nation: Political Gridlock and the Immigration Crisis," "Reforma Energética y Estado de Derecho en México," "Binational Commons: Institutional Development and Governance on the U.S.-Mexico Border," and "The Future of U.S.-Mexico Relations: Strategic Foresight." In addition, he has authored several book chapters and journal publications.

Payan earned a B.A. in philosophy and classical languages from the University of Dallas and an MBA from the University of Dallas Graduate School of Management. He received a doctorate degree in international relations from Georgetown University in 2001.
